Pass it on! Now that you know how, share it with others. Here are ideas to get you started.

Citizenship/ Leadership

- Volunteer to demonstrate obedience training techniques
- Collect dog food, towels and rags for the local animal shelter
- Volunteer to help at the county or state fair Dog show
- Volunteer to do a Dog presentation
- Raise a service dog

Communication

- Design a poster on parts of the animal
- Participate in a judging contest giving oral reasons
- Teach someone about the care and maintenance of owning a dog.

Are you Into It?

In the Dog project you can explore learning about raising and training dogs, health issues, and careers.

You will be able to:

- Learn major dog breeds and identification of their characteristics
- Study responsibilities of dog ownership
- Learn the basic principles of dog care and management in feeding, handling, record-keeping, grooming and fitting
- Learn dog health regulations, first aid, and simple treatments for ailments.

Here's what you can do all year!

Starting Out Basic

- Identify different breeds
- Locate and name parts of a dog: internal and external
- Learn proper feed and feeding techniques
- Learn basic obedience training and showmanship
- Purchase and use the appropriate grooming equipment and techniques
- Be a good sport when showing your animals

Learning More Intermediate

- More about nutrients
- Begin to start agility training with your dog
- Explore the difference between class, breed and variety
- Describe signs of a healthy dog
- Learn about health issues that affect dogs

Expanding Horizons Advanced

- Conduct a judging clinic
- Begin to enter into AKC /UKC junior shows
- Investigate DNA and genetics
- Starting a career in vet science, dog grooming or pet sitting

Healthy Living

- Explore the best practices of nutritious advantages to feeding your dog
- Daily exercise with your dog as walking or playing

Science

- Explore research on dog behavior
- Learn the science behind dog nutrition, growth and development, and genetics
- Explore how service dogs are trained



Expand Your Experiences in the Dog Project

- Attend a Dog shows in nearby counties and observe the judge and their techniques
- Learn about service animals and the process for fostering and training a service animal
- Visit a pet-sitting service
- Write an educational article about some aspect of your dog project for your newspaper
- Participate in a Dog skill-a-thon or Quiz Bowl Team
- Attend an AKC /UKC Dog Show note the differences
- Explore what kinds of dogs make the best pets – compare breeds
- Research parasites and how they affect dogs and how to protect your dog
- Explore the subject of animal assisted therapy, how it is used and the benefits
- Register for 4-H University to attend workshops, participate in community service events, hear keynotes, compete in contests, have fun, and meet other youth from across Florida: florida4h.org

- Search the internet and see what other state 4-H programs are doing in Dog
- Contact your county Extension office for other local workshops, and events
