



Below is a list of the Florida 4-H Executive Board committees. Each Executive Board Member will be placed on two committees. Rank the committees, one (being your first choice) through four (being your last choice). There is no guarantee that you will get the committee of your first choice. You will receive an e-mail by the last week of August, 2017 from your committee chair.

#### **Event Committees**

Each event committee shall plan at least one leadership/citizenship event every year, which corresponds to its committee name.

#### **4-H Legislature**

On this committee, members work in youth-adult partnerships to plan and prepare for the 4-H Legislature event that is held annually in Tallahassee at the Florida Capitol. Committee members have various duties such as writing the bills that comprise the bill book for the event, designing a T-shirt, and working on promotion. During the week of Legislature, each of the committee members hold a specific leadership role as a part of the legislative process, such as Speaker of the House, Committee Chair, Head Lobbyist, etc.

#### **4-H University**

The 4-H University Committee is made up of dedicated youth and adults who pick a theme, prepare the agenda, and plan FL 4-H U. This group plans everything from the key note speaker to workshop tracks to the banquet. During the event, the University Committee leads funshops, assists with evening programs, and helps keep the event running smoothly.

#### **4-H Day at the Capitol and Constitution Committee**

Members of the 4-H Day at the Capitol & Constitution Committee help plan 4-H Day at the Capitol. Youth on this committee will assist with promotions for the event and help lead webinars to train 4-H Members on topics such as "How to make an Appointment with a Legislator" and "4-H Talking Points." These youth will also reach out to Legislatures to inform them about the Florida 4-H Program. Additionally, this committee reviews the Florida 4-H Constitution and Bylaws each year and promotes constitutional understanding.

#### **Intermediate State**

Intermediate State is a weekend for Intermediate 4-H youth, ages 11-13. Members of this committee will help plan Intermediate State weekend. Members' responsibilities will include planning and teaching workshops and funshops, picking a key note speaker, and being cabin counselors. During this event members will mentor younger 4-H members and let them know what they have to look forward to as senior 4-H members.

**State Project Committee**

The State Project Committee is focused on serving the community. In this committee, community service events are planned that incorporate the current state service theme. The theme for 2015-2017 will be, "Clothing the World." The main goals of the State Project Committee are to hold a service project at every state event and to promote the state project. Committee members will be working hard to come up with fun, new ideas to keep people engaged in the spirit of serving others.

**Ways and Means Committee**

The Ways and Means Committee is in charge of planning and running effective fundraisers for the state 4-H program. The committee's main responsibilities include the State Council Store, Legislature flower sales, and smaller "fun"draisers which are held at different state events. This year, the committee members will work with the UF IFAS Development Team to be ambassadors of the Florida 4-H Program.
